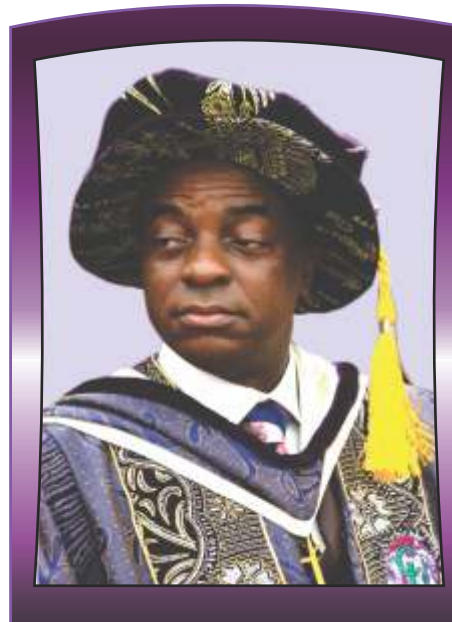

Our pedagogy and curriculum are designed to raise a new generation of leaders who are spiritually and mentally equipped to restore the dignity of the Blackman.

Vision 10:2022 and THE Rankings

I am pleased to inform this audience that by the grace of God, Covenant's vision 10:2022, to be listed among the top ten universities in the world by 2022 is snowballing into a reality. Our ReCITE strategy (Research, Citation, Innovation, Income, and Teaching), to intensify research activities and encourage publications in reputable and Scopus indexed Journals as well as citations in addition to

continuous improvements in the learning environment, continues to yield bountiful dividends. Within the last one year the university has been listed in seven prestigious rankings of Times Higher Education.

Presently, Covenant is ranked in the 601-800 bracket in the Times Higher Education World

University Ranking for 2019. This ranking places Covenant as the best university in Nigeria and West Africa as well as being among the top **97th percentile of universities in the world**. Out of the 442 universities in the THE Emerging Economies University Ranking in 2019, Covenant was ranked 151. In the 2019 subject rankings, Covenant was ranked 501-600 in engineering and technology in addition to being ranked 500+ in business and economics. Among the top 10 Universities in Africa, Covenant is ranked #6. Further to her 301+ ranking in the maiden edition of the THE University Impact Rankings, Covenant is now in the elite group of Top 1.2% of universities globally. Recently, the Young Universities Ranking was announced and Covenant has been ranked in the 151-200 bracket. In the recently released subset of the Young Universities Ranking—the Millennium Ranking, Covenant emerged #36. And just two days ago, on the 17th of July Covenant Ranked (801-1000) at The World Reputation Rankings announced in Hong Kong at THE Leadership and Management Summit.

Growing Research Profile

Overtime, the research profile of the university has continued grow in leaps and bounds. According to Elsevier's Scival –data analytic tool, in 2018, Covenant emerged as the topmost Nigerian Institution by publication volume for the year. Seventy-five (75) members of faculty at Covenant University were listed among the top 10 Nigerian authors in various subject areas, according to recent computations by Elsevier's SciVal. Covenant emerged first position at the 2018 Technology and Innovation Exhibition organized by the Federal Ministry of Science and Technology. Moreover, Covenant has been selected to host the African Centre of Excellence in Applied Informatics and Communication. The University had received patents for several products.

Contributions Towards the SDGs

As a leading world class university, Covenant University is committed to supporting and encouraging research and development work aimed at providing innovative solutions to

societal problems and enhancing the quality of life enunciated in the sustainable development goals. Time and space will not permit me to mention all the ways Covenant has contributed towards the realization of these goals. Nevertheless, it suffices to state that in our quest to ensure healthy lives and promote wellbeing for all at all ages, the university created ten (10) functional sub-clusters under the auspices of Covenant University Public Health & Well-being Research Cluster, each carrying out research activities in specific health-related areas.

In addition, through health impact initiatives, the university has contributed to the goal of good health and wellbeing through local, national, and global collaborations with institutions such as the University of Florida on prostate cancer and Health Forever, a registered healthcare provider, which provides alternative herbal preparations. This collaboration is aimed at providing a framework for the development of collaborative products. The partnership also covers collaborations on training and dissemination of research information

emanating from the efforts of both parties, which are central to the growth of the Nigerian health sector and her integration into global discourse. Moreover, the university had undertaken health outreaches to several communities in her efforts to promote health and wellbeing. Beneficiary communities include Ketu-Adie-Qwe and Adefarasin where a borehole and free malaria treatment by our medical team was provided. The university is also involved in publishing health and wellbeing related data in open format, particularly in international peer reviewed journals, conference papers, book chapters, and books. We also permit local primary and secondary schools to use our sports complex for their inter-house sports competitions.

On quality education, Covenant has been providing lifelong learning opportunities through granting public access to resources of our Centre for Learning Resources. Through our Onesimous project Covenant is involved with other stakeholders in providing Life Recovery Pre-Release Empowerment

Programme to prison inmates, to equip them with requisite skills for productive post-release life and reintegration to society. As a university committed to resolving the leadership challenges of the Continent, our African Leadership Development Centre provides our students and leaders at different levels with certificate courses in leadership.

In the same vein, our Centre for Lifelong Learning has been involved in promoting quality education by providing short courses in diverse fields of education and training. Our public and inaugural lectures have been platforms for initiating public discourse on diverse topical issues affecting our development as a nation and proffering solutions. So far, the university has hosted 40 and 20 public and inaugural lectures respectively. Recently, the university hosted the Covenant Model United Nations as a means to educating young people on how to restructure the future through innovation. Over 300 delegates from 8 countries and 12

institutions attended the conference. In addition, women and children in Ifekowa local council development area were recently provided with requisite skills needed to actualize five of the SDGs in their local community, following the launch of literacy and empowerment programme by our Community Development Impact Initiative Committee in collaboration with our Women Development and Human Society Initiatives Research Cluster. To avail more people with the quality of education being offered at Covenant, the university is in the process of launching its open and distance learning programme. Under the book project of our Student Council, educational outreaches are undertaken to selected primary and secondary schools within our host community. In recognition of Covenant's contributions to the SDG on quality education, she was ranked 201-300 bracket in the maiden edition of Times Higher Education Impact Ranking.

According to the 2018 edition of The Nigerian Graduate Report, published by Stutern, an online platform that focuses on training and connecting talented youths in Nigeria with employers for internships as well as entry-level jobs, Covenant has the most employable graduates rating in Nigeria. In recognition of Covenant's contributions to entrepreneurship education in Nigeria The Entrepreneurship and Empowerment Initiative of Nigeria (TEEiN) presented the university with her 2018 "Excellence in Quality Entrepreneurship Education" Award. Also, in recognition of Covenant as a leading university, she has been selected to host postgraduate scholars under the auspices of Queen Elizabeth Commonwealth Scholarship for the 2019/2020 cycle.

Furthermore, as part of its contribution to gender equality, Covenant continues to systematically measure and track women application and enrollment rate in higher education institutions within the university and

the nation. Consequently, several international peer reviewed researched publications along this line has been sponsored by the University. Through the Faculty Women Advance, the University provides targeted support to female faculty to promote the totality of women across careers and culture to empower women to achieve significant results in their fields of research,



As part of promoting Sustainable Cities and Communities, the university continues to engage in platforms that promotes research in sustainable cities and communities. Our Smart and IoT Enabled Communities and the Built Environment research clusters are involved in research activities that promote the realization of sustainable cities and communities. To encourage arts and heritage, the university provides public access to her

libraries, facilities, and resources. The Centre for Learning Resources holds a monthly seminar to which members of the public are invited to attend. Moreover, members of the public visiting our campus have unrestrained access to open and green spaces on campus for relaxation and recreation.



On governance, the university has undergraduate and postgraduate student governance structures in recognition of student governance. The university through the industry partnership unit of CUCRID, continues to identify and engage with local stakeholders external to the university such as professional associations, companies, MAN, NACCIMA, NGOs etc. The university provides expert advice to the local government and undertakes focus research with government departments. She signed an MOU with

Ota/Ado-odo local government on health. The university through the Democracy Day Parley provides a neutral and safe platform for different political stakeholders to come together to frankly discuss challenges.

Also, to ensure best practices, in governance, the university has established policies which address plagiarism and other forms of dishonesty, ethics and harassment. The university have policies that supports academic freedom through its appointment and promotion criteria for faculty. Covenant is involved in providing upskilling and capacity building to policy makers on relevant topics through short courses of the African Leadership Development Centre.

Covenant continues to relate with NGOs and governments to advance the actualization of the SDGs through involvements and inputs in SDG policy development, including identifying problems and challenges, developing policies and strategies, modelling likely future. She participated in the 2018 United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) Global People's Summit and offered what was

adjudged the best presentation on how Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) could be realized. The UN declared the Covenant Global People's Hub as the best at the conclusion of the Summit, which featured a global live telecast of activities at the Covenant end and from other hubs in New York and other parts of the world. The university initiates and participates in cross-sectoral dialogues about the SDGs. For example, discussions are ongoing between Covenant and CYCDI on collaboration on how to ensure that leadership changes for the better in Africa in the near future. Moreover, the university has continued to organize series of international conferences on sustainable development. In the current academic session over eight of such conferences were hosted by

Covenant participates in international collaborations on gathering and measuring data for SDGs through publications. She is involved in international collaborations and research review comparative approaches and development of international best practices on tackling the SDGs through researched publications on various SDGs. The university collaborates with NGOs to undertake SDGs promoting activities through student volunteering programmes, research programmes, development of educational resource such as literacy empowerment programme at Ifekowa local council development area, Project One Million Souls, a mission to orphanages, and exploring collaboration on students exchange with the International Association for the Exchange of Students for Technical Experience, to enhance the technical and professional development of our students.

Concluding Remarks

Once again, we are celebrating the products of our life-applicable learning process with the

award of 1,341 Bachelor's and 239 higher degrees in various disciplines, having found the graduands to be worthy in character and in learning. In the Bachelor's degree category, 215 (16.03%) of the graduands made first class, 668 (49.81%) second class upper division, 415 (30.95%) second class lower division, and 43 (3.21%) third class. As for higher degrees, there are 42 Ph.D, 152 M.Sc, 23 M.Eng 23, MBA 16, M.A 4, and PGD 2.

At this juncture, I congratulate you the 14th set of graduating students, parents, relatives and friends for this milestone accomplished today. I wish to remind you that the myriads of challenges currently bedeviling our country may appear daunting, but they provide you opportunities to make a difference.

Dr Monisoye Olorunsola Afolabi has had a professional career of about 40 years as an academician, administrator, diplomat, computer specialist and international development expert.

After obtaining a first-class degree in Mathematics at the Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Nigeria in 1973, Dr. Afolabi was

awarded a Canadian Commonwealth Scholarship to the University of Waterloo, Waterloo, Ontario, Canada in 1974 where he obtained a Master of Mathematics (M.Math) Degree in Computer Science (1976) and a Ph.D. in Computer Science (1979).

Dr. Afolabi assumed duty in the Department of Computer Sciences of the University of Lagos in 1979 and later joined the University of Ilorin, in 1982 as Chief Systems Analyst and Head of the Computer Center and was appointed Director of the Centre in 1987. He served as Secretary of the Committee of Directors of University Computer Centres (CDNUCC) from 1983 to 1988.

Dr. Afolabi was appointed the Pioneer Director of the Community Computer Centre of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) in May 1989. In 2005-2007, Dr. Afolabi served as Acting Deputy Executive Secretary of ECOWAS in charge of Integration Programmes. In this capacity, he supervised Technical Departments responsible for Human Development

(Education, Health, Youth, and Gender, Drug Control, etc.), Infrastructure (ICT, Energy, Transport), and Agriculture including Rural Development. He retired from ECOWAS Commission in October 2010. Upon his retirement from ECOWAS, Dr Afolabi has served as a Consultant for ECOWAS, USAID, DANIDA, in the areas of trade and transport Facilitation, business environment, intergovernmental relations, institutional collaboration, information technology, and strategic project development and management. Since 2008 to date, Dr Afolabi has chaired the meetings of the e-Governance Forum of Directors of ICT, and Heads of Service of the Federal and 36 States, as a Consultant to the Administrative Staff College of Nigeria (ASCON). Dr Afolabi is currently Senior Regional Technical Advisor to the USAID Trade Africa Project in Accra, Ghana.

Dr Afolabi was born in 1950 and is married with children and grandchildren.

Professor Peter Okebukola DSc, PhD, FSAN, FSTAN, FIAE, DSSE, OFR is a Distinguished Professor of Science and Computer Education at Lagos State University, Nigeria. He had his higher education at the University of Ibadan where

he obtained his Bachelor's degree in 1973 followed by Master's and Ph.D degrees in Science Education in the same university. He had specialized science and technology training at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (M.I.T.), and Harvard University, both in Cambridge, USA. He is a Fellow of the Science Association of Nigeria (SAN), Fellow and President of the Nigerian Association for Environmental Education and Fellow and past President of the Science Teachers Association of Nigeria (STAN). He won the prestigious 1992 UNESCO Prize for the Communication of Science.

He has won several international gold medals in science, environmental and computer education. He has served as team leader of several quality assurance projects involving UNESCO, the African Union, the World Bank, Association of African Universities and the Global University

Network for Innovation (GUNI-Africa).

He was concurrently the Chairman of Council of four Nigerian universities. He is currently the Chairman of Council of the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), Chairman, Board of Trustees of Crawford University, Chairman, Board of Trustees of Caleb University. He is the Executive Chairman, Okebukola Science Foundation. He was Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission. He has been awarded a number of honorary D.Sc degrees. He is the recipient of the National Honour of the Officer of the Order of the Federal Republic- OFR. He is the Chairman of the Advisory Council of the American Council for Higher Education International Quality Group (CIQG) whose mandate is observatory of quality assurance of higher education across the world.

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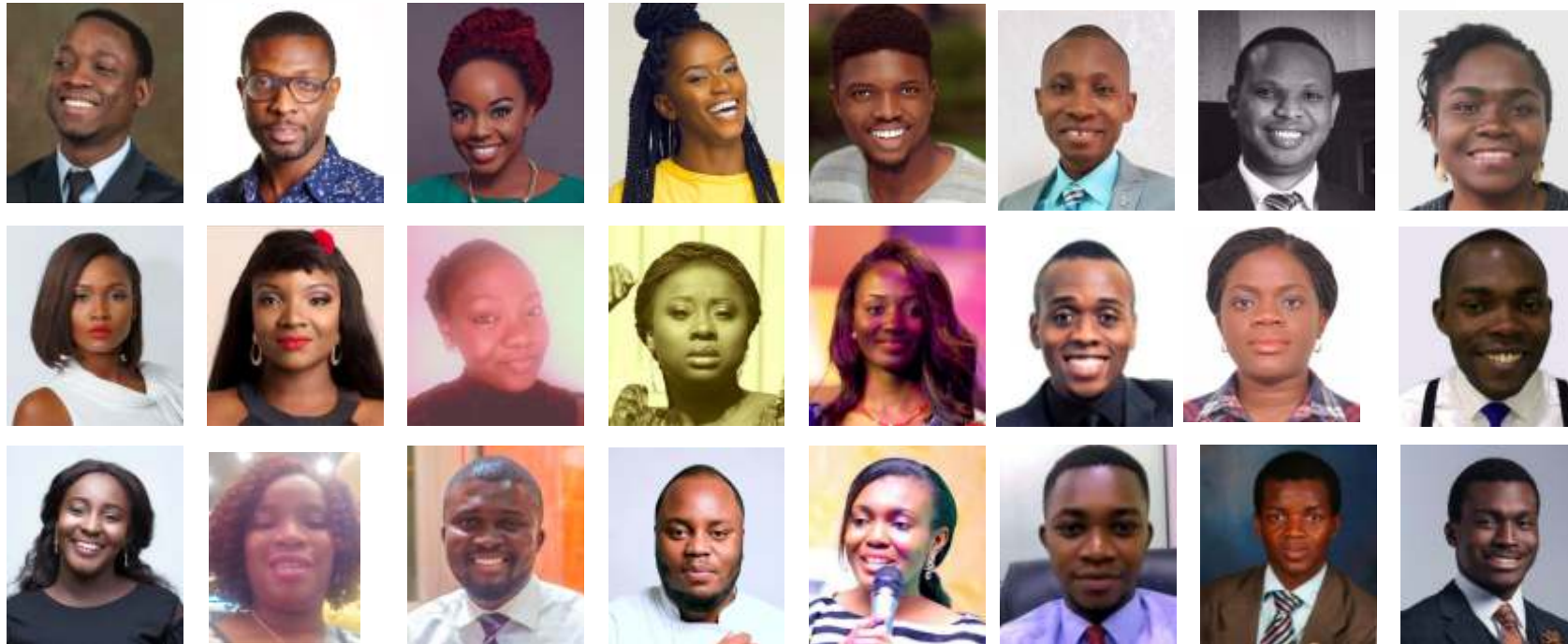
