

In order to ensure a smooth and hitch-free celebration, we offer the following guidelines:


The congregation should remain standing as the Chancellor's procession advances or exits from the convocation ground.



As we look back at over our graduates we celebrate the fact that the preceding sets of eagles





Professor Olugbemi Jegede, at the invitation of the Federal Government of Nigeria to restart open and distance learning activities in Nigeria assumed position as the National Coordinator of the National Open and Distance Learning Programmes in 2001 and subsequently was appointed in 2003 as the founding Vice Chancellor of the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN). Professor Jegede, as Vice Chancellor of the fledgling institution, concerned himself with activities and responsibilities associated with the establishment of the new institution. These included the development of the Blueprint, the university strategic plan, capacity building in ODL for Nigeria and the West Africa sub-region, course material development, admissions, hiring and training of all cadres of staffing for the young nationally funded university and forging partnership with renowned and well established distance teaching and open learning institutions and organisations across the world. By the time Professor Jegede completed his term as Vice Chancellor in October 2010, he had raised the 6year old university to number 7 best university in Nigeria as per the Webometric global ranking of universities.

Prior to his special assignment in Nigeria, Professor Jegede served in various capacities in different parts of the world including being the founding Director, Centre for Research in Distance & Adult Learning, The Open University of Hong Kong; Foundation Head, Research & Evaluation

Unit Distance Education Centre, The University of Southern Queensland, Toowoomba, Australia; Staff in charge of the M.Ed programme by ODL at the Curtin University of Technology Science and Mathematics Education Centre, Perth, Australia; and Foundation Dean and Professor of Education; Head, Department of Education, Faculty of Education, The University of Abuja, Nigeria. He has practiced as a distinguished Science Educator and an ODL professional for the past three and a half decades with demonstrable expertise in the areas of Instructional Design, ODL Management, Course Materials development, Psycho-Social Environment and Learning with particular reference to the Socio-cultural influences, Teacher Preparation and Professional Development, Knowledge Engineering and Cognitive Science, Assessment and Evaluation of Learning, Information and Communication Technologies in Instructional Delivery and ODL Research.

Professor Jegede has the honour and privilege of being one of the few academics in the world who by his exceptional and prolific research and publications is a Professor in two distinct academic areas. As a chair Professor in both Science Education and Open and Distance Learning, he



obtained his B.Sc.Ed and M.Ed degrees at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Nigeria and his Ph.D at the University College of Wales, Cardiff, UK. He is a chartered biologist of the UK Institute of Biology and a recipient of several awards including the University of Southern Queensland Award for Excellence in Research (1995), the Fellowship of the Science Teachers Association of Nigeria (1996), The People State and Resource Development in Nigeria Merit Award (2002), and Kwame Nkrumah Africa Leadership Award for professional contribution to the development of Education in Africa (2004). Professor Jegede has published extensively in various internationally referred journals in both science education and ODL reflecting many areas of knowledge and practice including those listed above. He has served/ continues to serve as a member of the Advisory Board, Editorial Board or as Editor of several journals in Science Education, ODL and Learning and Instruction

worldwide. He is a member of the International Council for Distance Education and served as Chairman of its taskforce on research in 1995. He has served as Chair, Planning Committee, Association for Development in Education in Africa (ADEA) Ministerial Regional Meeting, July, 2004; Member, The International Programme Committee, The International Council for Open and Distance Education 20th World Conference on Open Learning and Distance Education, Hong Kong, 3-5 June 2003; and he is a past Chairman/President and member of the Executive Board of the African Council for Distance Education (ACDE). Professor Jegede is the UNESCO Chair in Open and Distance Learning, National Open University of Nigeria. He was voted the Best Vice-Chancellor of the year 2009 by the National Association of Nigerian Students and got the African Leadership Award for Excellence for Tertiary Education in 2009. Professor Jegede was the recipient of the Hitachi Software of Japan Award of Hitachi Prominent

African Leaders for Change in Education in 2010. He is the founding Director of the African Council Distance Education-Quality Assurance & Accreditation Agency (ACDE-QAAA). Professor Jegede is the African Representative on the International Programme Committee for The International Council for Open and Distance Education 20th World Conference on Open Learning and Distance Education coming up in November, 2011 in Indonesia.

Prof. Jegede, a highly spirited man, has in addition to serving Nigeria in academic and professional capacities been of tremendous support for the Church of Nigeria Anglican Communion. He is the Facilitator of the Northern Elders Laity Forum of the Anglican Communion and Chairman of the Education

Committee of the Diocese of Lokoja. He was honoured in 2010 by his home Diocese with the Nehemiah Award for rebuilding and restoring Anglican Communion to the pride it used to enjoy since 1911 when Anglicanism first reached Ogori. He has been of assistance to very many Anglican dioceses in Nigeria and has assisted other denominations and Muslim communities in the country.

Professor Olugbemi Jegede was recently appointed to the esteemed continental position of the Secretary General of the Association of African Universities (AAU) in December 2010 where he oversees the administration of the apex organization and principal forum for consultation, exchange of information and cooperation among all the universities in Africa.

Professor Naana Jane Opoku-Agyemang, has been the Vice-Chancellor of University of Cape Coast, Ghana, and also the first female Vice-Chancellor of a state University in Ghana since October 1, 2008. She is currently the Chairperson, Association of West African Universities and Chairperson Vice-Chancellors of Ghana.

PERSONAL LIFE

Born on November 22, 1951 in Cape Coast, Ghana, Professor Naana Jane Opoku-Agyemang attended Anglican Girl's Secondary School at Koforidua and Aburi Presby Girl's School. She then had her secondary education at the Wesley Girls High School in Cape Coast from 1964 to 1971, where she was the School Prefect in her final year. She completed B. A.(Hons) Ed. at the University of Cape Coast in 1977 and obtained her Masters and Doctorate degrees from York University in Toronto, Canada in 1980 and 1986 respectively.

CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND HONOURS

She has held various academic positions at the University of Cape Coast including being Head of the Department of English, Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Warden of Adehwe Hall, Valco Trust Fund Post-Graduate Hostel, and Dean of

School of Graduate Studies and Research. From 1997, she has held the position of Academic Director of the School for International Training in the History and Cultures of the African Diaspora.

In March, 2007, she was one of five eminent scholars selected from around the world to the United Nations Headquarters in New York to deliver presentations during the 200th Anniversary of the Abolition of Slavery.

In October 2009, she was elected Ghana's representative to the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)

She has served on the editorial boards of many reputed journals around the world. 

Innovative Teaching and Community Development Efforts

In the area of teaching, the University has continued to blaze the trail by not only ensuring high standards of pedagogy among its faculty but has also periodically organized seminars, workshops, mentoring chats, teaching enhancing seminars, public lectures to improve the quality of teaching, delivery, a rarity in similar institutions in the country to date.

These capacity building activities are in addition to numerous university sponsored external conferences and worship both locally and internationally, have continued to place Covenant University as a University of repute.

In order to further enrich the knowledge base of its faculty and staff in line with its visionary drive of becoming a world class university, the University runs annual Executive Advance for all its Faculty and Senior Non-Teaching Staff at the beginning of every academic session. The Executive Advance series are rich in content and draws high quality resource persons from within and outside the University. Some of the themes of past Advances are: "Corporate Strategies for Building Efficient Teams", (2008/2009 Academic Session);

"Constructing A World Class University: Pathways and Process" (2009/2010 Academic Session); "Capacity Building for Continued Relevance" (2010/2011 Academic Session). As a revolution in education, Covenant University through its unique programmes, has redefined University education in Nigeria and Africa as it sets out to restore academic relevance to the University context in the Continent. The University's custom built programmes of Total Man Concept (TMC), Entrepreneurial Development Studies (EDS) and Towards A Total Graduate (TTG), are very innovative and impactful in raising Agents of Change in all spheres of human endeavours. While the fundamental philosophy and essence

of TMC is premised on accessing the total make-up of human kind from the spirit, soul and body in order to prepare and equip students with the relevant life skills and mindset, which will provide them anchorage as they wade through the tidal waters of life, TTG is an important aspect of the learning culture at Covenant University put in place to ensure smooth transition from the classroom to the external context of the world of work and society at large.

The second custom built course of Covenant University, Entrepreneurial Development Studies (EDS) runs across all levels in the two semesters of the University and it is compulsory for all students. It involves both the thought courses and the practical hands-on components. The University



also has a dedicated Centre for Entrepreneurial Development Studies, which takes care of the practical and vocational aspects of EDS. The Centre in partnership with the National Universities Commission (NUC) recently hosted National Workshop on Capacity Building for Entrepreneurship Educators in the all Nigerian Universities.

The impact of EDS programme is evident in the testimonies of graduates of the University becoming employers of labour thereby making their contributions in addressing unemployment in our nation.



Teaching in Covenant University is conducted in an ICT-supported environment. The University is equipped with a network computer base in excess of 1000, over 8,000 personal laptop computers enabled by wireless hot spots /Internet access, a myriad of lecture halls, theatres and laboratories equipped with high-tech electronic boards providing adequate facilities for Teaching and Research along the lines of the 33 programmes in the University's six Schools and two Colleges of Development Studies and Science & Technology.

At Covenant University, we engage in reaching out and adding value on a regular basis to communities. Under our Community Development Impact Initiative Programme, our faculty, staff and students have been directly involved in the provision of clean water (sinking of boreholes), environmental sanitation and road maintenance in the communities. The University has also launched a pilot Community ICT Empowerment Project in some secondary schools in Ota where it also presented computers systems and accessories. The University has strategic programmes to grow its host community-Ota. Under this initiative known as 'Grow Ota Project', the University has commissioned a series of research efforts aimed at poverty reduction in the locality. The Centre for Entrepreneurial



Development Studies is also impacting and building the manpower capacity of the communities via skill acquisition training in the area of fish farming, snailry, bead and soap making, tie and dye, fashion designing etc.


Covenant University public lecture series delivered by some of its eminent professors on various topics have continued to promote town-gown initiatives. Between 2003 to date, Covenant University can boast of 30 Public Lectures and one inaugural Lecture, focusing on core aspect of our life with clear idea of identifying indigenous solutions.

These lectures are in addition to periodic Staff Parley, an innovative interactive platform which enables University faculty to contribute ideas to guide public policy formulation and implementation.

Communiqués generated at the parleys are publicized through the mass media.

In 2010 and 2011 Academic Session alone, the University has hosted seven conferences and workshops.

CUTTING-EDGE RESEARCH and DEVELOPMENT

From the very beginning, Covenant University set out to be a research University. It has directed its efforts towards providing solution to the myriad of challenges in Africa by investing in cutting-edge

research, leading to products and patents. In 2010 for example, three (3) certificates of patents were awarded to the University by the National Office for Technological Acquisition and Promotion (NOTAP), Abuja, for three products “Paw-paw Beverage”, “Fermented Rice” and “Culture Medium” from the staple of Bio-Technology Research cluster lead by Professor Louis Egwari. They were the first to be registered in the country in that year as at June 2010. To facilitate patenting by staff and external researchers, NOTAP has commissioned an IPTTO office in Covenant University Centre for Research and Development (CUCERD) where investors can process their patents applications.

Covenant University is making enviable marks in cutting-edge research in the area of Bioinformatics and Biotechnology where it has robust research clusters in addition to driving an active research agenda across all the departments in the University.

Covenant University Opinion Poll Unit (CUOPU) through its national survey has continued to set the pace in electoral forecast in the current National elections in Nigeria. All its results published in the national news media have all been validated by the electorates at the polls.

At the Nigerian Universities Research and

Development Fair (NURESDEF) held at the University of Nigeria Nsukka in December 2010, Covenant University won three awards and was adjudged the overall second best among 25 Universities that exhibited over 200 Science and Technology Products. Covenant University's research activities enjoy the immense support of the Board of Regents headed by the Chancellor of Covenant University, Dr. David Oyedepo. In his words: “I will rather waste money on research than keep it fallow”. This is attested to by the fact that during this last session alone, apart from a Seed grant of N50million naira support directly given for research work, the Mission also spent about N1.1 billion on cutting-edge research equipment. This strategic gesture is yielding positive dividend in terms of robust research and product development.





PLANT NAMING in Covenant University

At Covenant University, we pride ourselves as being environment friendly, and as having a truly “green surrounding”. We have in no little way tried practising sustainable architecture and civil engineering. We have endeavoured to leave a sizeable part of the endemic plant population on ground during our constructions. While we hope to retain as much as we can, our biodiversity heritage; we have further improved the diversity and aesthetic value of our flora endowment by introducing some other plants principally for ornamental purposes. In Covenant University, we consider a visit to our campus one of the most important recruiting strategies for students; parents as well as other guests regardless of their purpose for visit.

With an increasing need for awareness on the known fact that a third of plants face extinction in the near future; we face a tall order in a world where, as one botanist put it recently, “even common is becoming rare”; hence we believe even great attempts no matter how laudable can begin with a little effort as we already have started here. We owe all visitors and occupants of Covenant University good information about the plants around them. Not only does good information lead to higher levels of satisfaction with plants, it also lead often to actions that may help the course of biodiversity conservation, no matter how little.

Labelling plants with scientific tags is one of the most critical steps for keeping track and information about the diversity of the flora collections and composition of a location. Enlightening all regardless of the class, academic or social standing is imperative in our age and what can be most informative about our environment than the knowledge of the plants we interact with daily, whether at home, work, playing, driving and reading. Enlarging the “living classroom” is a drive we hope to achieve and informing all about the environment by knowledge of the plants that principally control the health status of environment is our target.

Plant tags are simple technology that helps us preserve valuable facts about plants; the more information we can acquire and keep about a plant, the more informed and better dispose we are on matters bordering on such plants. Tags with the right information add value to ordinary plants; making seemingly ordinary objects more valuable because of the provenance, added history and story now attached and associated with them.

Though the information inscribable on a tag almost seems too minimal for use, and incomplete, it has significant meaning, whether technical or personal. We encourage you to enjoy the information, pride yourself in a crash botanical taxonomic course, and afterward tag your plant collections, inscribing whatever bits of data you feel is relevant to your gardening, horticultural or



landscaping live. Though the notes we put on plant tags may not remind us to do something, they do remind us of things of importance – our plants.

Ours is not only a green but also a clean environment. We strive continually to maintain a friendly, green, healthy and informative environment. Waste management, clean-ups and proper information we believe are keys to better environment management. You will be earnestly informed about a number of things in Covenant University; one of such is the plant naming project we presently undertake. Have a wonderful time in the green and environmentally friendly campus of Covenant University.
