CITATION OF MRS. OBIAGELI EZEKWESILI CFR -KEYNOTE SPEAKER

e are blessed today to receive as Keynote Speaker a high flier, an achiever and an icon. Dr. Ezekwesili is a Chartered Accountant and holds a Master's degree in International Law & Diplomacy from the University of Lagos, a Master's degree in Public Policy & Administration from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government, and a Bachelor's degree from the University of Nigeria, Nsukka. Dr. Ezekwesili began her career with Deloitte & Touche where she worked as an auditor, management and financial services consultant. She then served as a founding Director of Transparency International (TI) and as its Director for Africa from 1994 to 1999.

Between 2000 and 2002, she worked with Professor Jeffrey Sachs as Director of Harvard - Nigeria Economic Strategy Program, during which time she was also appointed as an aide to President Obasanjo. In 2003, she was designated Senior Special Assistant to the President of Nigeria on Budget Monitoring and Price Intelligence.

As Minister of Solid Minerals from 2005 to 2006, Ms. Ezekwesili oversaw the passage of the Minerals and Mining Act, the establishment of the Nigerian Mining Cadastre Office and the opening of the sector to private participation. Ms Ezekwesili also servedas the Chairperson of the Nigerian Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (NEITI)from 2004. She led the team of NEITI to the voluntary

sign-on of Nigeria to the EITI Principles as well as the first ever process, financial and physical audit of

Nigeria's oil and gas sector. She also served as the Honourable Minister of Education.

As Minister of Education in the Government of Nigeria, she led a comprehensive reform program within the education sector including restructuring and refocusing the ministry for the attainment of Education for ALL (EfA) targets and Millennium Development Goals. She also introduced the Public- Private Partnership models for education service delivery. She revamped the Federal Inspectorate Service as an improved Quality Assurance mechanism and introduced transparency and accountability mechanisms for better governance of the budget. Ms. Ezekwesili led the establishment of the Innovation and Vocational Enterprise Institutions Initiative which focuses on the development of skills for economic competitiveness.

It was from her position as Minister of Education that she was appointed Vice President for the World Bank's Africa Region in 2007 from which she disengaged in May of 2012. She oversaw more than 1800 staff and was responsible for the delivery of projects. Under her leadership, the Bank committed \$40 billion to the new project lending program in Africa. From a careful study of



400 economic and analytical scenarios, she was able to offer Africa, unparalleled knowledge services including technical assistance.

In 2006, Ms. Ezekwesili was honoured with the prestigious award of the Commander of the Federal Republic (CFR). She is married to Pastor Chinedu Ezekwesili and they have three sons. Ms. Ezekwesili is embarking on a new Soros Foundation, a funded initiative to establish a pro-reform public policy center for Africa based in Abuja. She is also associated with the founding of an Africa – wide graduate school of public policy to produce capable and competent public servants for African countries. Here indeed, is a true daughter of Africa poised for the transformation of her world.

Ladies and gentlemen, may we receive our Distinguished Keynote Speaker, DR. OBIAGELI EZEKWESILI who as her name suggests is indeed, suitable for enthronement.





CITATION OF DR AKIN OPARISON -DISTINGUISHED CONVOCATION LECTURER

t is indeed a great privilege to introduce **Dr. Akin Oparison** a very rare gem who has accepted to present today's Guest Lecture.

Akin obtained a B.Sc Honours degree in Human Physiology from the University of Ibadan. Nigeria and started his working career as a medical sales representative with May and Baker a multinational pharmaceutical company, in Nigeria. He left this company, initially to pursue a Master's Degree in Business Administration and ended up obtaining an M.Sc and a Ph.D in Business Policy and Organizational Development from the university of Wales, Cardiff.

He returned to Nigeria and went back to his Alma Mater

as a lecturer on the university's MBA program. In 1987, Dr. Oparison joined Price Waterhouse as a Management Consultant with a focus on Human Resource Management. In 1991 he was invited to take up the position of Head of Human Resources for Sterling Winthrop, another multinational Pharmaceutical and Consumer Health Products Company in Nigeria. He worked hard to develop and run the Management Development Training programmes for the Middle East, Africa and Asian Subcontinent (MEAASC) region of Sterling Winthrop.

In 1995, Akin was head-hunted by British American Tobacco to join the Board of its Nigerian subsidiary, a publicly quoted company, as HR Director. He also doubled as Regional HR Manager for West Africa. In 1998, He was seconded to Russia for two years as Compensation and Benefits Manager to harmonize and implement western type performance management, reward and benefits model, practices and processes in two major Soviet companies which British American Tobacco had just acquired in that country.

Our distinguished Guest Lecturer returned to Nigeria as part of a Management team that was charged with winding up an almost 60 years old publicly quoted company where BAT had controlling shares. The team thereafter reestablished a new 100% BAT owned company. 



rom the very beginning, Covenant University set out to be a research University. It has directed it efforts towards providing solution to the

myriad of challenges in Africa by investing in cutting-edge research, leading to products and patents. In 2010 for example, three (3) certificates of patents were awarded to the University by the National Office for Technological Acquisition and Promotion (NOTAP), Abuja,

for three products "Paw-paw Beverage", "Fermented Rice" and "Culture Medium" from the staple of Bio-Technology Research cluster lead by Professor Louis Egwari. They were the first to be registered in the country in that year as at June 2010.To facilitate patenting by staff and external researchers, NOTAP has commissioned an IPTTO office in Covenant University Centre for Research and Development (CUCERD) where investors

patents applications.

Covenant University is making enviable marks in cutting-edge research in the area of Bioinformatics and Biotechnology where it has robust research clusters in addition to driving an active research agenda across all the departments in the University.

Covenant University Opinion Poll Unit (CUOPU) through its national survey has continued to set the pace in electoral forecast

in the current National elections in Nigeria. All its results published in the national news media have all been validated by the electorates at the polls.

At the Nigerian Universities Research and Development Fair (NURESDEF) held at the University of Nigeria Nsukka in December 2010, Covenant University won three awards and was adjudged the overall second best among 25 Universities that exhibited over 200 Science and Technology Products.

Covenant University's research activities enjoy the immense support of the Board of Regents headed by the Chancellor of Covenant University, Dr. David Oyedepo. In his words: "I will rather waste money on research than keep it fallow". This is attested to by the fact that during this last session alone, apart from a Seed grant of N50million naira support directly given for research work, the Mission also spent about N1.1 billion on cutting-edge research equipment. This strategic gesture is yielding positive dividend in terms of robust research and product development. Recently, the University's research team invented a fuel generating sets.






